BULMANS ROAD URBANISATION – CONSULTATION REPORT JUNE 2021

Community Consultation:

Council undertook community consultation online via the Melton Conversation website. Council letter dropped 450 houses in the catchment area advertising the consultation period (03 May - 31 May 2021). It was also advertised on social media and Council's website.

Council received 83 responses. A summary of the feedback received is below. Council has commented on each issue raised.

Key Decisions

Additional parking along Bulmans Road added into the project scope.	The top concern from the community is the reduced car parking along Bulmans Road. In order to deliver the project scope (bus zone, bike lanes, shared path and centre median islands) to make the area safer, some existing car parking located directly out the front of the school had to be reduced. It is Councils view that there is sufficient parking in the area within 400m of the schools.	Councils Traffic Team to prepare a parking brochure to assist the school community as to where available car parking can be found within a short walk of the schools.
Formalising Parking for Learning Centre (Happy Feet)	The current arrangement of parking on the nature strip is not in accordance with Councils Local Laws. Currently 8 vehicles park on the nature strip to access the Learning Centre. There is available space to include formalised on-street parking arrangement (underground services can be avoided). Council to consider including this into the scope of works and explore design options.	Council to explore design options and if budget permits implement/deliver formalised on-street parking out the front of the Learning Centre. Include preferred design as a Tender Option and assess when tender pricing is receipted.
